


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### 1 John 5:10

- The Spirit gives an inner testimony for the one who trusts in the visible/verbal testimony.
  - The inner testimony:
    - Comes after one hears and believes the outer testimony.
    - Is not the only testimony nor the priority testimony.
  - The inner testimony (Romans 8:16) is supplemental to the outer testimony (2 Peter 1:19-20)
- Unbelief is the greatest sin. It is the equivalent of calling God a liar.
  - "he has not believed" is in the perfect tense. The unbeliever made a decision not to believe, and stands firm in their decision.

### 1 John 5:11-12

- The testimony we have, and that God has given, is that "God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son."
  - God gave (aorist) life and the life is (present) in His Son.
- The testimony about receiving that which has been given is also clear: it is only found in the Son.
- The truth of verses 11-12 have to be included in our evangelism.
  - God gave eternal life in a once-for-all act of propitiation.
  - That eternal life is found only in His Son, Jesus Christ.

### 1 John 5:11-12

#### Translation issues

- "The testimony is this: God has given us eternal life, and this life has its source in his Son. Whoever has the Son has this life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life." (1 John 5:11–12, GNB)
  - The life is not source in Jesus, it is in Jesus.
  - Jesus is eternal life (a statement made in John's prologue of 1 John 1:1-2)
- "This is the testimony in essence: God gave us eternal life; the life is in his Son. So, whoever has the Son, has life; whoever rejects the Son, rejects life." (1 John 5:11–12, The Message)
  - There is no "essence" to the testimony. It is what it is!
  - One does not need to reject the Son and thus reject life. A person is born without the Son and thus without the life.
  - John 3:18, "he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God"


### 1 John 5:11-12

#### Translation issues

- "If you have the Son, you have eternal life. If you do not have the Son of God, you are not acquainted with true life." (v. 12, The Voice)
- This fails to warn people of the consequence for rejecting Jesus Christ. The problem is not that such a person wouldn't have true life but that such a person would have death and second death.
  It is doctrinal malpractice to translate the Scripture in such a way.

### 1 John 5:13

- What are "These things?"
  - The entire letter?
  - The context of chapter 5?
- I prefer to take 1:1-4 as the "purpose statement" of the book, and v.
  13 as the summary of the belief section of chapter 5.
  - Do you believe that Jesus is the Messiah? (v. 1)
  - Do you believe that Jesus is the Son of God? (v. 5)
  - Do you believe "into" the Son of God? (v. 10)
  - Since believe is a verb, it has an action. Do you "faith into the Son of God?"



### 1 John 5:13

- The KJV contains an additional phrase that expresses an additional purpose of the writing-
  - For the believer: that you might know that you have eternal life
  - For the unbeliever (presumably), that "ye may believe on the name of the Son of God."
